

Not only did we reach more women than ever before, we saw God move powerfully across every area of the mission. We expanded bed capacity for emergency and stabilization care, creating more space for women to find safety and breathe again. We took meaningful steps toward becoming a nationally recognized ministry, allowing the message of freedom and restoration to reach far beyond our local community. And we began renovations on the Freedom Center, transforming a place once marked for the selling and profiting off of sexual identity and vulnerability into a future place of healing, hope, and long term restoration.

None of this happened by accident. Each milestone is a testimony to God's faithfulness and to the commitment of donors, volunteers, partners, and prayer warriors who stood with us and believed in this work.




MINISTRY INCOME


MINISTRY EXPENSES
