Possession and use of substances of any kind will not be permitted under any circumstances while in the house. This is a sober program. This includes possession of drug-related material.



There is no email, social media, cell phone or internet allowed. These are necessary safety precautions to keep all our residents safe and protect the location of our safe house. You will be able to use the phone with a staff member for case management purposes.



If you own a car, you will not be able to use it while living at the safe house, or keep it on site.



We do have required quiet times as follows: In your room at 9 pm and lights out at 10 pm. We start the day at 8 am on weekdays and 9am on weekends.



All medications are taken under supervision of staff.



You do not need a clean UA to access services.



Please note you are with staff at all times during the duration of your stay while off the safe house property. The safe house is not a lock down facility and you are free to leave the program, should you choose, at any time. If you choose to leave, you will be eligible to return to the program after 30 days.



Our services are free.



Two (2) bags maximum may be brought with you.



Use of Methadone, benzodiazepines, stimulants of any kind, and opioid pain medications are not allowed. Suboxone is allowed.



Smoking is allowed with the cigarettes provided. You may not bring your own cigarettes. No vaping allowed.



Helping Captives is a faith-based program. We do not require participation in daily devotions or church, but we do require attendance in our daily classes that do have a faith element to them. Faith and Christianity are an integral part of our program.
